Hiroshi Esaki (1951-2023)



This is Koji's older brother, Hiroshi, taken on April 1, the day he drove to pick Koji up at his Chiryu station. On April 26, he was admitted to the hospital with stage 4 renal cancer. We were the ones to take care of his final affairs. Hiroshi was not a believer.

Koji said to him, "You are entrusting me to take care of the last days of your life, will you entrust me to advise you about the next life?" He agreed to listen to Koji as a pastor.

Jesus called himself the gate, "if any man enter he shall be saved." (John 10:9) The gate is common all over Japan as entry to shrines and temples. The gate marks a transition from the mundane world to the sacred world. In the ten-minute increments allowed by the hospital, Koji explained that Jesus was the living gate that would lead him to heaven. Hiroshi had his life regrets, and it seemed God had prepared his heart for this moment. On May 12, Hiroshi was baptized. Two weeks later he was unconscious. On June 5, he passed away.
