Missions are intended to be a visible demonstration of God's love for mankind; therefore, we must pay attention to the preaching and teaching of the gospel *in the context* of the living experiences of the people – their struggles, spiritual lives and physical needs. Missions should not be just an act of ministering *to* the people, but in conjunction *with* them. By entering into a partnership with indigenous people, we benefit from their understanding of the local culture and become better equipped to administer God's kingdom.

- 18 month program of seminary training and learning for missionaries and pastors who are called to a specific geographic area

- Candidates must be Christians who are saved by faith alone in the finishing work of Jesus and have at least a High School diploma

Christian Foundation For Education

CFE's vision is to give financial and spiritual support to children and youth who are impoverished, and to help them achieve a sound education. We want to connect each child with sponsors and build genuine relationships. CFE also supports theological education and training, and strives to always present the gospel and sharing of God's love journey.

The cost to cover the schooling for each child is \$100. This amount pays for all school fees, uniforms, materials and transportations.

Currently, CFE supports 91 children in Togo, Burkina Faso and Liberia. This year we are adding 7



children in Burma, 10 in Ivory Cost, and 10 in Central Regions of Africa.
