NEW BEGINNINGS SCHOOL

School has started two weeks prior to our arrival. For both sites we count 438 kids, three months to fifteen years old. In addition to Togo, the children are from various countries like Chad, Niger, Nigeria, including seventy muslim kids.



ARMANDINE

We are so much amazed by this girl named Armandine who started prekindergarten since she was 3 years old. It was a battle to bring her to school until last years , in fourth grade, she confessed all she was going through in the spiritual realm, she confessed how difficult she was as a child with her grandparents who are raising her in precarious conditions. She does not know her own father till now and her mother is mentally and physically handicapped. Armandine has totally changed this year, coming to school on her own and happy. She loves praying and encouraging her peers who suffer from sickness. It was just last week I could find books for her. She was so happy. She does not have a birth certificate but she needs it this year so she can pass her first national exam. We are begging the grand parents to hurry and establish it for her. She prayed for a classmate whose ankle and leg was hurting and couldn't walk; she got healed. We praise the Lord for her life.



FARMING MINISTRY

As this is harvest time here in Togo, we were able to bring home 6 bags of corn, bambara groundnut that my mother used to grow, and beans are the final crop that remains to be harvested.



AMANA CONFERENCE

Our annual missions conference that is held every first week of August, in Lome town or in the village to bring missions awareness to our church people, preach to good news and love the poor, the needy, the orphan and the widow. It is a spiritual battle but every year we witness God goodness, power and faithfulness.
