Its been a fruitful ministry partnering with you and the church. ReST has been growing steadily with the prayer and financial support you generously contributed. As of now we will soon (hopefully in July) be occupying the campus with new class rooms and buildings constructed out of your help. Until now we run our classes in the church office. These developments and growth encourages me to carry my load. (photo attached)

This year we have 10 students in B. Th, and 25 students in Ministerial Foundation Course (MFC), a distant learning program taught in our dialect.

However, on the other side are also challenges that surprise us or await us as we move along. While there are steady infrastructure developments are going on, my regular support for salary and training expenses experienced financial shortage for five months now. The reason is because of the price rise. For example a litre of petrol cost Rs. 80 in January now it has come up to Rs. 108 and the same goes for every other commodities.

Another reason is that we have 3 students from Myanmar who could not continue their study or stay in their country because of the political situation in Myanmar, and we need to accomodate them with any possible help we could provide. (photo attached)

I am reluctant to inform you about my financial situation over and above what you have been contributing, and this kept me from letting you know for a while. I am aware that we all have a tight budget and what you set aside for ReST ministry is out of your love for God and the ministry.
