Burying Pain is a Way to Survive but Not a Way to Grow

Jeffrv Munroe's new book. Reading Buechner, has been encouraging for us. Munroe says, Frederick Buechner reframes the parable in Matthew 25 to suggest it could be about pain and not money. The third servant takes what he is given and buries it: "I was afraid." We, all of us, have good reason to be afraid....So we dig the hole in the ground, in ourselves or in our busyness. When we bury pain we bury all manner of things, including joy. Pain is universal, and giving ourselves permission to feel and acknowledge pain is liberating. Our stories of pain are among the most intimate gifts we can give each other.

"Soft" Emergency Measures End in Osaka

On April 7, Japan adopted Emergency Measures. One factor that shook the country was when a well-loved comedian, Ken Shimura, died of Covid19 on March 29. Everyone felt they knew him. The Tokyo Mayor pleaded in his name to initiate measures.

The Emergency Measures were met with relief, but remained mostly voluntary. Eventually, train and subway travel dropped by 70%, and business and restaurant activity slowed.

The results have been largely successful to contain deaths, and to keep the health system from being overwhelmed.

The country was not prepared to do public schools online, and businesses scrambled but succeeded in making online work viable.

Now things are beginning to cautiously open up.
