Ministry Update from Rene and Lani Quimbo serving in the Philippines with PMI

Dear Friends,

It was a fellowship to remember for the several youths at the **Zamboanga City Christian Church** who were invited to join in an overnight gathering at the church. It was not only to encourage these young people to deepen their faith through a growing understanding of who God is, but also to create a sense of belonging and connection among them, and to inspire them to participate in service activities within the church.

It is with deep sorrow to share with you that one of the most active worshippers in the congregation has fallen away from the faith. She was the first one to commit to be baptized and to publicly profess her faith in Christ. She was also the first one who boldly declared to her Muslim clan that she will no longer get involved in their clan’s religious activities and that she will begin to fully commit to live for Christ alone. However, a few days before the scheduled baptism and public profession of faith, she came to the church to inform us that her mother was admitted

at the hospital’s ICU and she could not defy her mother’s wishes for her not to go through with her commitment. Not long after this, she suddenly fell ill in the middle of the night and had to be rushed to the hospital where she was diagnosed with ulcer. And while in great pain, she was convinced by her mother to return to the Muslim faith. She has a big family and extended family as well who were worshipping with us. They all stopped coming to church. Somehow, we didn’t get surprised by this. When she allowed her mother’s sickness to deter her from her commitment, it revealed her doubt and lack of faith in Christ. Still, what happened was very painful to us, we mourned her lack of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. *Please remember to pray for her and her family that God may grant them understanding to discern the truth.*

God opened an opportunity for our church in El Salvador City to teach a Sunday afternoon bible study in **Luyong Bonbon**, a barangay (district) in the municipality of Opol. It is held at the barangay zone 4 center hall. *Please pray with us that God’s word will nurture the faith of those who already believed, and may it open the door of faith to those who do not.*
